Enthusiasm, a love of boating, and a sense of giving back, are some of the instincts that result in volunteering to teach a CPS course. Some of our instructors have a background in education, but that is not a prerequisite: for every course, there are guidelines for each class and its learning objectives. Then there is the **Instructor Development Course**, a programme that concentrates on theories of education, lesson-planning, and the presentation and delivery of a class. In April, 2013, the Halifax Squadron held an ID course. Over the course of 2 weekends, instructors were on the other side of the desk, but also taking to the floor to give 5-, 10- and 15-minute presentations on which they were assessed by their peers.

Material from the Boating Course manual serves as the basis for presentations and for a detailed lesson plan, which, along with a final exam on theory, make up the course requirements. Successful completion gives participants the Recognized Instructor designation (required for government courses like the PCOC and ROC(M) but most useful for teaching any course).
