#### "Those Winter Covers"

**Now** is the most happiest of times for most boat owners, Spring. After a very long, long, and cold winter, we are finally getting the covers off. If you are one of the boat owners who have wisely chosen to use a re-usable canvas type cover, proper care and storage of the cover will insure many years of reliable use. Depending upon the fabric type, the process is basically the same. First, clean the cover with a power-washer (carefully) to remove any environmental dirt & debris. Hang the cover up on a line in the yard and dry it completely. Once the cover is clean it is ready for any repairs that may be necessary. Get these done now as the fall is usually busy time for canvas shops (making new winter covers for those smart boaters) If the cover is a treated canvas, you can waterproof it with a product called "Canvax". This is a product designed for natural canvas and should not be used for synthetic materials. It is fairly reasonable cost and easy to use following instructions on the can. This product is available from most canvas shops. After the cover is dry, fold it up and store in a dry place till the sad time (Fall) arrives again. If the fabric is a synthetic, there several types of waterproofing products that you can use. For this information, you should contact a canvas shop and see which product to use to waterproof your cover. The newer covers are made from these light weight fabrics which have many good qualities and are much easier to install. The same applies to these covers, clean well, dry well and store in a dry location. Remember, water is the enemy here (only here) and if you do not clean and dry the covers completely, mold will rot your cover in a surprisingly fast amount of time.
